TORINO AIRPORT WINS FIRST PRIZE AT THE ACI EUROPE BEST AIRPORT AWARDS 2024

Torino Airport recognised as Best European Airport in its category by the Association that brings together more than 500 airports in 55 countries

Caselle Torinese, 4 July 2024 - Torino Airport wins the **first prize as Best European Airport** in its category at the 34th Annual Assembly and Congress of ACI Europe, taking place in Istanbul.

The Best Airport Awards, now in their 20th edition, **reward excellence and outstanding achievements by airports across their entire portfolio of airport activities**, and this year they honoured airports that have been able to push their business model into new territories, with new value creation models and embracing transformation and flexibility, taking care of people and the planet.

Torino Airport was judged by an independent jury of civil aviation experts from the European Commission, Eurocontrol, SESAR Joint Undertaking, the International Transport Forum and FlightGlobal.

First in the category under 5 million passengers, Torino Airport was praised for an impressive combination of driving **traffic recovery** through a proactive approach to securing new connectivity, its efforts in the field of **sustainability**, its focus on **passenger service quality**, and its important **impact on the local economy**.

Speaking during the ceremony, **Torino Airport CEO Andrea Andorno** said: "I'm proud to welcome this recognition for our airport, awarded as best European airport in 2024 in its category. My sincere thanks go to ACI Europe and the entire jury, who recognised the value of the efforts made over the past year.
